If you are wondering what the festive theme is all about, we want to share the happy news with you that PetPals turned **5 years old** in September 2013!

Our organisation is very small, with basically just Dawie & Yolanda doing all the hard work on the ground (in the Morkels Cottage, Beverly Hills and Rusthof informal areas in the Strand). However, we believe that the stats below show that PetPals has made quite a difference over the last 5 years. These stats show the results of PetPals' voluntary work since September 2008, although Dawie & Yolanda have been involved with animal welfare activities in the area since 2006.

# Canine Content



PetPals has a few cheerful doggie stories we would like to share with you.

#### The cross wire-haired Ami

Earlier this year, PetPals was collecting two kittens in Rusthof, Strand for their vaccines when Ami was spotted in the street. She was sterilised through PetPals a while ago, and her stiches needed to be taken out. Dawie & Yolanda stopped quickly to remove the stitches, and were shocked to hear from people in the street that Ami's owners had moved and simply left her behind... Ami was filthy and covered in fleas and ticks. Ami was immediately taken for a dip, bath and cut, and through amazing networking, Ami was adopted on that very same day!



At the time, Ami had an elderly Jack Russell companion at her new home, but unfortunately the old doggie died not long thereafter. They had not been together for long, but Ami was very fond of her canine friend. PetPals worked together with the AWS in Gordon's Bay to find a suitable doggie companion for Ami as soon as possible, and it was not long before another rescued dog (also a Jack Russell) joined Ami and her family. All went exceptionally well right from the start, as can be seen from the pic above. These two rescued doggies are loved and spoilt rotten, we are so glad for both of them, and obviously very grateful for the wonderful family who adopted them both!

### German Shepherds Galore



These two beautiful Shepherd dogs had rehomed after their owners moved to a premises too small for the big dogs. It is very difficult to find a home for large-breed dogs. but fortunately wonderful people living on a two acre plot just outside Somerset West decided to adopt both dogs. 
The same misfortune of owners who had to move to a smaller premises happened to Ceasar as well, but for some or other reason it took much longer to rehome Ceasar. He is such a gorgeous, well socialized, loving dog that we thought he would easily find a new home, but we advertised his story for months before he finally went to a wonderful home in Somerset West. Ceasar (now called Cody) finally found the doggie heaven he deserved, with a plush and spacious garden, a canine playmate called Bella, and a loving human family.



## Another dog called Tessa

This Tessa is not a PetPals-rescue, but since we all love happy endings, we just had to share her story with you. Wendy and Andre, who adopted a rescued doggie from PetPals long ago, contacted PetPals earlier this year from Richards Bay for advice on possible adoption organisations in the area after they rescued a starving puppy (now Tessa) from the middle of the N2 just outside Richards Bay. Wendy's version of the story goes as follows:

"She seemed to be oblivious to the trucks driving past her at 120kph as she ravenously searched for insects to eat. We immediately picked her up and headed for the nearest vet in Richards Bay. Her examination revealed severe biliary and hook worm which had made her very anaemic and unable to control her own body temperature... The vet said she was in a very bad condition and probably wouldn't make it. I named her Tessa and we put her in hospital on a drip for 2 nights. During this time her story went onto Facebook and a wonderful lady by the name of Delia (who already had 11 dogs and several cats) offered her a loving home in Richards Bay. Thank you Delia, for being Tessa's angel..."

# Juliette & Max


In a PetPals newsletter distributed earlier this year, we told you about Juliette whose 5 kittens were all adopted before she finally found a wonderful forever home as well.
